The theme of this year's program is "Catholicism 101". Accordingly, participants through such lens will be learning about and exploring topics, including: Central Catholic Beliefs; Authority (Scriptures, Tradition, Magisterium); The Sacraments (Holy Mysteries); The Liturgical Year; The Most Sacred Mystery of the Eucharist (the Mass); Worship, Prayer and Music; Introduction to Catholic Social Teaching; Mary; and The Communion of Saints.
